



Eligibility & Voter Registration:

Who can vote? To vote in a town election in Saskatchewan, you must:

- be a Canadian citizen;
- be at least 18 years of age;
- have lived in SK for at least 6 consecutive months immediately before election day and;
- lived in The Town of Eston for at least 3 consecutive months immediately before election day; or
- be the owner of assessable land situated in the municipality for at least 3 consecutive months immediately before election day.

Required Identification for Voting:

Photo ID:

- Government-issued photo ID that has your photo, name and civic address is the best option.

Non-Photo ID options:

- Valid ID cards issued by Canadian or Saskatchewan government, municipality or school division, a Saskatchewan Indian Band or one of these entities;
- personal correspondence, benefit/contribution statements and tax/assessment notices issued by any of the above entities;
- bank/credit union cards, credit cards and statements;
- utility bills and statements issued within **six months** of the date of the election; and
- personalized attestation of residence, letter of stay or admission form issued by a seniors or student residence, long-term care or shelter facility..

Vouching:

If you do not have acceptable ID but are accompanied by another voter who has acceptable ID and is entitled to vote at the same polling place, you can be vouched for by that individual using the form available at the polling station from an election official.
